# **CANADA'S INDIGENOUS PEOPLES**

Indigenous peoples - First Nations, Métis, and Inuit - live in every region of the country, on reserves and in towns and cities, and comprise about four per cent of Canada's population, or roughly 1.2 million people.


In 2015 and 2016, 399 Indigenous companies from across Alberta had direct business (goods and/or services) valued at \$3.33B with oil sands operators. These companies represent 65 communities across Alberta.

# **INDUSTRY IN ACTION**

## **Devon Canada - Conklin High School**

In 2010, the community of Conklin opened the doors to its new (and only) high school, the building of which was funded, supported, and coordinated by one of the oil and natural gas companies operating in the area.

## Imperial Oil Resources Limited - Northern Development Program

Imperial's Northern Development Program (NDP) at its Norman Wells asset provides a two-year training program for members of the Sahtu communities which can evolve into full-time career positions if available. The program was initiated in 1990, has had a total of 34 trainees and 23 graduates. As of 2017, 10 graduates are employed as career employees. Imperial is currently interviewing for new NDP positions in both the plant and field.

## **Northeast Alberta Apprenticeship Initiative**

The Northeast Alberta Apprenticeship Initiative (NEAAI) is a partnership between industry, First Nations, post-secondary institutions, and the Alberta and federal governments. The NEAAI provides a support system to increase the number of skilled aboriginal trades people in accordance with labour needs in the area.

# **Fort McKay Group of Companies**

The Fort McKay Group of Companies LP (FMGOC), which works extensively with oil sands operations through its six divisions, produces more than \$150 million in revenue annually. The FMGOC is completely owned and controlled by the Fort McKay First Nation.





In 2015 and 2016, total funding for community investment in the oil sands was \$48.6 million, which includes contributions such as sponsorship for community activities, in-kind investments and contributions to community infrastructure.
